Our volunteer panel supported the open dialogue by sharing their own successes, lessons, and guidance to help the teenagers identify and execute healthy relationship behaviors.

Mentors Make A Difference

Think of mentors as nurturing adults who volunteer who give their time and energy to young people by providing encouragement, non-judgmental support, guidance, and positive role modeling. A mentor's role is to enable mentees to stay focused and motivated in school and other activities by providing them with a sense of structure, helping them to overcome obstacles, and encouraging them to work toward achieving their educational and career goals.

Research has found that young people seem to benefit the most from mentors who engage them in specific, structured activities (rather than only engaging them in supportive conversations... though of course supportive conversations can be extremely helpful, too). Many mentees find that when they have caring adult mentors in their lives, their grades go up; their life and career goals become more solidified; and their sense of self-esteem increases substantially.

A mentor and mentee relationship works due to the strong rapport or bond that is built between the two. A hopeful, positive attitude along with strong expectations from both the mentor and mentee will bring positive energy and can make for good mentoring relationships.

Become an Against All Odds Mentor

Against All Odds mentors offers assistance to new mothers who might benefit from a friendly mentor/mentee relationship. Our mentors are carefully selected and help create possibilities by promoting a supportive environment for each teenage mother serving as role models in academic, personal and professional growth. Our mentees are offered an opportunity to work with committed, caring adults who will help promote a positive attitude toward their future.

Role of a Mentor

- Take the lead in supporting a young person, teen or mother through an ongoing, one-on-one relationship
- Serve as a positive role model and strengthen the new mother's support system
- Build a relationship by initiating planned activities
- Strive for mutual respect
- Participate in setting goals and work toward accomplishing your stated objectives
- Identify strengths and reinforce protective factors for the child

Time Commitment

- Make a 12 month commitment to being a mentor to a new mom
- Visit with the mother at least twice a month with weekly contact
- Attend mentor, mentee group activities, mentor support groups and/or program recognition events

Triple P Parenting

Practiced throughout 25 different countries, the Triple P – Positive Parenting Program gives parents simple tips to help manage big and small family challenges without dictating *how* to parent. The program covers a multitude of parenting concerns including toddler tantrums, self-esteem issues, disobedience, aggression, and teenage rebellion to name a few.

Triple P offers different strategies to choose from to build a plan that suits each family's situation and beliefs.

The Positive Parenting Program will help you:

- Raise happy, confident kids
- Manage misbehavior so everyone in the family enjoys life more
- Set rules and routines that everyone respects and follows
- Encourage behavior you like
- Take care of yourself as a parent
- Feel confident you're doing the right thing

Because each family is different, Triple P has a range of ways to get your positive parenting help. Choose anything from single visit consultations to public seminars; group courses to private sessions. You can even do Triple P online at home.
